

## Drama Clubs

Club Title	Description
<b>Drumming club</b>	Drumming club is a group that runs on Monday evenings from 3-4pm in L108. It allows students to experience a wide range of percussion instruments in a variety of different styles of music. Guest artists occasionally attend to widen children's experience and provide more focused workshops. All age and ability ranges are encouraged to come and no prior experience is necessary.
<b>Choir</b>	The choir rehearses on Tuesday evenings from 3-4pm in Drama 2. The choir has been very successful this year with numerous performances both in school and around the area. The highlight of the year was performing a Christmas repertoire for Jaguar Landrover workers in their production rooms.
<b>Drama club (KS3)</b>	KS3 Drama Club runs on Tuesday evenings from 3-4pm in Drama 1. This interactive group encourages any student in years 7, 8 or 9 to attend and experience a variety of drama disciplines. The club has produced performances that have been used in The Big Event and the Lyndon Christmas Show.
<b>Drama club (KS4)</b>	KS4 Drama Club runs on Thursday evenings from 3-4pm in Drama 1. This drama group is actually a theatre company and they not only practice drama but also devise and create their own performances. They are looking forward to competing with other theatre companies in the area and nationwide. Due to this high level of skill, this club is only open to students in years 10 and 11, although they do NOT need to be taking GCSE Drama.
<b>Street dance</b>	Street Dance is a group run by Miss Newman on Thursdays from 3-4pm. This group is open to boys and girls in all year groups. The street dancers have been involved in numerous performances this year including the Big Event and the Christmas Show. This club requires quite a lot of strenuous physical activity and students are expected to bring loose fitting athletic kit to change into.
<b>Ballet</b>	Ballet is a club run by Miss Newman on Tuesdays from 3-4pm. This group is open to boys and girls in all year groups. The ballet dancers have been involved in numerous performances this year including the Big Event and the Christmas Show. This club requires quite a lot of strenuous physical activity and students are expected to bring loose fitting athletic kit to change into.
<b>Film club</b>	Every Monday afternoon the lights go down and the silver screen comes up with Film Club run by Mr. Spurr. Students of any year group are invited to Drama 1 to watch a different feature each week. Entry costs £1 and includes a soft drink and a snack. Films are viewed in the cinema-like atmosphere and are then reviewed by students during Media Club during Tuesday breaktime. Past films have included: Star Trek, The Boy in Striped Pajamas & Twilight
<b>Media club</b>	Media Club runs every Tuesday with Mr. Spurr in the Lookout. Students from all years are welcome to attend and polish their skills in editing, producing, filming, camera work mainly on the Apple Mac platform. Students are involved in activities to help promote the profile of the school using industry standard hardware & software to help them produce work of a high standard.
<b>Tech crew</b>	Tech Crew runs every second Thursday with Mr. Spurr in the Hub. Students from all years are welcome to attend. Anyone interested in the inner workings of theatre and the backstage intricacies of live performance should not miss this club. Lighting boards, sound desks and much more are used to create an unforgettable atmosphere for all performances at Lyndon School. Without tech crew, most of these performances would be unable to happen.
